






With our continued drive towards good attendance of at least 95% and higher, we would ask that all routine medical and dental appointments are made outside of the school day.



Please put your entry in the box in reception by Thursday 19th October. The name will be drawn on Friday 20th October in celebration assembly.


Hot Chocolate Friday with Miss Myers
