It is also essential that the children have sun cream applied before the start of the day and this can be left in their bags for reapplication as needed by the children themselves. Staff can verbally support to ensure the whole bottle isn't applied in one go or wiped into eyes! Sun hats are also essential so make sure your child has one with their name written in clearly.

As we approach what is set to be another scorching weekend, may we wish you a safe and relaxing weekend. Don't forget there is a weather warning in place so keep in the shade and drink lots of water!

Should your child be unwell and unable to attend that day, please contact the office to let us know and this will be recorded on our registers.



With the hope of warmer days ahead, please can we remind you all about sun safety and well-being.

Every child should have their water bottle in school every day. All classes have access to water dispensers so that bottles can be topped up during the day as we are encouraging them to drink more to keep hydrated.

On warmer, sunny days, please can we ask for your child to come to school with an application of sun cream already on. Under health and safety guidance, we cannot apply sun cream to any child but can guide and support them in doing it themselves should they need an additional application.

Sun hats are great for shading little faces and eyes. Please ensure all hats are named clearly!

Taking Care of our Outside Areas

We are so lucky at Grange to have wonderful outside areas and gardens.
We have recently planted an orchard and the whole school has been busy growing plants and adding to the planting boxes we have around school.

Mrs Kennell has been taking care of our sensory garden so we would like to remind families that this garden should not be accessed by the children at the beginning or end of the day. There is a sign on the gate, but please make sure the children do not enter as there has been some damage to the plants and pathways.

Similarly, we would ask that the children do not enter the wooded area prior to the start of the school day.

We are lucky enough to have a fantastic forest schools area but this is being repeatedly damaged by visitors.
