We encourage the children to wear black plimsolls or plain black trainers




Attendance

Keeping Safe Online

E-Safety, Internet Safety and Cyber Bullying are major issues affecting the lives of young people today.

At Grange Infants, we raise awareness on E-safety through our Computing Curriculum, school assemblies and our PSHE units. Whilst our Computing curriculum teaches pupils a range of skills and how to apply these in real life, E-safety is at the core of each lesson. We also focus on E-safety week held in February which coincides with National Safer Internet Day. This year's theme was 'Inspiring Change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change on line. Mrs Cave led an assembly to raise awareness and you can find more information using this link:

During our local authority visit this week, groups of children were spoken to about safeguarding and how they keep themselves safe online. It was clear from the conversations had, that the vast majority of children have access to at least 2 devices through which they can then game online.

The children were clear about what to do if content is scary but it was worrying to hear that many of them are gaming with people they do not know.

I cannot stress enough how important it is to supervise all online access and to check that filters are in place to prevent unwanted and harmful content from being downloaded.

As part of our drive towards keeping all of our families safe, e-safety will be a regular slot on our newsletters with helpful hints and tips for parents and carers, as well as signposting to support.

Please can we ask that you are vigilant about what your children are watching and accessing online, as young children can become confused and easily upset by what they see. We cannot stress enough how important it is that you supervise your child's internet use and are aware of what they may be accessing. Most internet providers will support families in putting parental controls and filters on devices within the home.

All classes have access to water dispensers so that bottles can be topped up during the day as we are encouraging them to drink more to keep hydrated. On warmer, sunny days, please can we ask for your child to come to school with an application of sun cream already on. Under health and safety guidance, we cannot apply sun cream to any child but can guide and support them in doing it themselves should they need an additional application.

Sun hats are great for shading little faces and eyes. Please make sure all hats are named clearly!

Hayfever/seasonal allergies

Along with the sunshine comes some of the less fun side effects of Summer!

If your child suffers with allergies and needs antihistamine, please be aware that you will need to provide this for use at school as we do not carry a supply. Medicine should be labelled with your child's name, and you will need

to complete a medical form at the office. Thank you!



PE Safety

As part of our drive towards healthy lifestyles and celebrating sport, please can we remind families that all jewellery must be removed for PE days. We have noticed a number of children wearing necklaces and bracelets which are not permitted due to the risk of injury. Children will be asked to remove these and they will be returned at the end of the day. Please can you make sure that children wear sensible and suitable footwear for PE. Our uniform states black plimsolls or plain, black trainers if possible.

For those classes who are doing gymnastics, the children MUST be in shorts. These can be brought in and kept at school. Thank you!


