Don't forget, the more you're in school, the more learning you can do!


Should your child be unwell and unable to attend that day, please contact the office to let us know and this will be recorded on our registers. During out of office hours, you will be able to leave a message.


Yellow Zig Zags

Tick Alert

We are so lucky to have a large amount of open space here that the children can access in warmer weather.

As many of you will be aware, we share the school site with a couple of families of foxes and whilst we love the relationship we have with nature, there are always things we need to be aware of...

Foxes and other British wildlife, carry ticks and these can be transferred onto long grass as they walk through. We remind children not to venture into longer grass and we do have the grass cut regularly but there is still the risk that ticks can be picked up.
