# Flu Vaccine

The children's nasal spray flu vaccine is safe and effective. It's offered every year to children to help protect them against <u>flu</u>.

Flu is caused by the influenza virus. It can be a very unpleasant illness for children. It can also lead to serious problems, such as <u>bronchitis</u> and <u>pneumonia</u>.

It is now usual practice for children to have their flu vaccine in school. This is done using a nasal spray that the school nursing team will carry out on **Monday 5<sup>th</sup> December**.

Please look out for a consent form which has been sent via email (do check your junk/spam!). The consent form must be completed and submitted to ensure your child gets this vaccine.


