Should the strikes go ahead as planned, it is hoped that impact will be minimal but there may be some operational changes such as classes being taught by different teaching teams and some changes to timetables. If larger numbers of teachers choose to strike, I may need to limit attendance but this would very much be a last resort. We will of course keep you up to date with any changes.

Please remember, there is always someone here to help, to advise and to listen. No worry, query or question is ever too big or too small! Find us on the playground in the morning and at the end of the day, or pop into the office to see one of the lovely office staff.

We can't wait to work with them!














