With the hope of warmer days ahead, please can we remind you all about sun safety and well-being.

Every child should have their water bottle in school every day. All classes have access to water dispensers so that bottles can be topped up during the day as we are encouraging them to drink more to keep hydrated.

On warmer, sunny days, please can we ask for your child to come to school with an application of sun cream already on. Under health and safety guidance, we cannot apply sun cream to any child but can guide and support them in doing it themselves should they need an additional application.

Sun hats are great for shading little faces and eyes. It's always a good idea to put a name on clearly!

Warmer Days on the Field

We are so lucky to have a large amount of open space here that the children can access in warmer weather. The field also has a range of climbing and gym equipment that the children love to use.

As many of you will be aware, we share the school site with a couple of families of foxes and whilst we love the relationship we have with nature, there are always things we need to be aware of...

Foxes and other British wildlife, carry ticks and these can be transferred onto long grass as they walk through.

We remind children not to venture into longer grass and we do have the grass cut regularly but there is still the risk that ticks can be picked up. Please look out for these little critters and use the link below for advice should you find one:


