


The day begins....



School opens at 8.45am for rolling registration 8.45-8.55am

Latecomers must report to the office and parents will be asked to sign their child in with the reason they are late to school.

Arriving **REGULARLY** and **ON TIME** ensures that your child doesn't miss out on the important learning activities that happen early in the day when they are most alert!!



Playtime: 10.40am- 11.00am

Lunch: 12.00pm- 1.00pm

Afternoon session: 1.00pm-3.15pm



Parents will need to sign their child out from the office if collecting their child for any reason during school hours.

Behaviour Policy

The school vision statement is embedded through our British Values, these were written in consultation with school staff.

Our school behaviour policy and our vision statement enable children who demonstrate positive attitude and behaviour to be praised and rewarded. The policy sets clear expectations regarding behaviour and sanctions that apply should children behave in an unacceptable way. The school's behaviour policy can be found on the school website.





The Importance of Attendance

Regular attendance, especially in their early years at school is extremely important to help your child achieve and reach their highest potential; it sets the foundations for their future and promotes a sense of routine and structure. Experiences gained in one lesson are often developed further in the next lesson, therefore missed learning can result in your child falling behind. As a parent, you have a legal responsibility to ensure your child attends regularly and **punctually**. If you ever have any concerns regarding your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to speak with Miss Myers, or a member of the attendance team. We always endeavour to be sensitive to needs and personal circumstances and strive to work together and offer our support in any way we can.

Reporting School Absence

If your child is going to be absent for any reason, please can you make sure you phone this through into the school office.

A message can also be left if there is no one to answer the phone.

We ask to see evidence of **all** appointments taken within school time. Please not that until evidence is seen by the school office staff, such absences will be recorded as unauthorised. These will be amended to authorised absence under the medical code, when evidence is produced. Thank you for your understanding.

Whilst we love Class Dojo and all that it offers, please can we ask that parents do not use the messaging service to report absence.

A child has an accident/medical need:

Any child who has a minor accident (falling over, bumps, grazes etc.), will be seen to by the classroom/ lunchtime staff team. More serious injuries are taken to the medical room and further advice sought.

All accidents are logged in the Accident Book and the child will receive a note detailing the injury, date and time, which is handed over at pickup to the parent/guardian.

In some situations, it may be deemed necessary to contact a parent/carer as a courtesy to inform them of an injury sustained at school prior to collection from school, or in some cases we may request that a parent can come to the school to assess their child's injury.

At Grange Infant School there are a number of adults trained to 'First Aid in Schools' Level.



A parent/carer wants to discuss their child's behaviour/progress:

Every parent/carer has the opportunity to meet with their child's teacher once a term for parent meetings. Should a you wish to discuss/ raise more urgent concerns prior the scheduled meetings, there is always someone here to help, to advise and to listen.

No worry, query or question is ever too big or too small!

We always have members of staff on the playground in the morning and at the end of the day, or pop into the office to see one of the office staff, who will be happy to help or able to make an appointment for you with the most appropriate member of staff.







Reading books are sent home every day; we encourage all children to read at home at least 3 times a week, and children can use Mathletics app/website at home (log ins are provided for all children) to complete fun and friendly Maths tasks! Years 1 and 2 a themed homework project is set for each half term. The theme is set in line with topics being covered at school with some ideas are provided, but the projects really are open to interpretation! This allows your child to lead their own learning and have fun! Projects are then exhibited in a showcase before each school holiday which parents are welcome to attend and make comments on the children's lovely creations!

Staying in touch and keeping up to date at Grange Infants

We always try our very best to keep you updated about what's happening at the school including events, trips and learning themes. In the last two years, we have moved away from paper-based communication and instead communicate with our families electronically via email, Class Dojo (our learning platform), our website and Facebook. All information can be found on these, so we strongly advise all of our families to engage with these and to check them regularly for updates:



We will use email to send out letters, forms and newsletters. Texts are usually sent for reminders or quick updates and attendance messages.



We use Class Dojo for class messages, homework and using individual portfolios for uploading and sharing work and photographs of your child's learning. You can also message your child's class teacher using this platform



We use Facebook as a fast way of updating you on events, news and requests.



Our website is full of useful information such as policies, school structure and staffing, curriculum overviews, a calendar and useful links.



Special educational needs and/or disabilities

Lunchtime at Grange Infants!

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a **meal**, **free of charge**, through central Government funding called Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM). Meals are cooked fresh to order and the children love placing their orders each morning at registration. Families are not means tested so why not let your child/ren tuck in to the delicious hot meals Hc3s offer!

The lunch menus works on a three-week cycle to make sure there is lots of variety and choice!

Healthy Packed Lunches

If you decide to bring a packed lunch in for your child it is still vital to provide a healthy and well balanced diet. A healthy packed lunch should include a variety of foods that contain the nutrients that children need across the food groups, and less foods that are high in sugar and saturated fat.

Due to allergies we ask that NO nut products are brought into school.



What if my child has a special requirement?

If your child requires a special diet for **medical** reasons, you will need to register with Hc3s in order for them to put a medically identified special diet menu in place at school.






Service Families

School Uniform

At Grange Infant School we sell school logo sweatshirts, cardigans, water bottles, and bookbags which are readily available to purchase from our school office.

But what else is part of our school uniform?.....



We ask that in winter children wear:

- ◆Black or grey trousers, skirts, shorts or pinafore dresses.
 - ♦ White polo shirts, shirts or blouses.
 - ♦ Black, grey or white socks or tights.
 - ◆School logo sweatshirt or cardigan.
- ♦ Winter hats, scarfs, coats and gloves.
- ◆Sensible, plain black shoes (no trainers)



We ask that in the summer children wear:

- ♦ Blue or white checked dresses.
- ♦ Black or grey shorts or trousers.
 - ◆Sun hats.
- ◆Sensible, plain black shoes (no trainers).



We also have a selection of 'new to you' uniform available upon request at the office.

Buying second hand clothes not only saves you money but is also good for the environment!

We have jumpers, cardigans, polo shirts, dresses, skirts and trousers available.

If you need any items, please just give us a call, drop us an email or pop into the office to see one of our friendly admin team any time during the school day.

Let us know the sizes you need and we will be more than happy to help.

P.E

We ask that PE kits consist of black shorts or trackies when it is colder and a plain white t-shirt. School jumpers or cardigans can be worn on top so please avoid hoodies or other sweatshirts.

We encourage the children to wear black plimsolls or plain black trainers.

<u>PLEASE</u> make sure that all uniform is clearly **labelled** with your **child's name.** This makes it so much easier to return the items if they find their way to our lost property bucket.

We understand that starting school is an important and exciting time for you and your child. To help build these foundations so that your child can enjoy life at school to the fullest, we have listed below some key skills we aim for your child to achieve prior to starting school in September:

Recognise their name





Independent using the toilet

Your child will be more confident in using the toilet at school if they have had the opportunity to practice at home!



Good hand hygiene

Helping your child wash their hands before and after food and using the toilet will make it easier for them to be independent during the school day and reduce the spread of infection.



Dressing Skills

Let your child practice putting their coat and shoes on and off. Encourage them to attempt to dress themselves in preparation for playtime and PE at school.

Blow their own nose and put the tissue in the bin




Emotional development

Can they can label how they are feeling?


Having the ability to do this will help children communicate with their friends and class adults so they feel supported and understood during their time at school and also understand others!
