Communication and language



We will be developing our language throughout our busy bee time based on our role play areas. Each class will have their role play based around a well-known story. We will also be starting 'Chatterbox' this half term where a child from each class will be chosen weekly to bring some special things in from home to share with the class — please look out for a letter in your child's bookbag.

English




The children will now be settled into their phonics groups. Some children will be recapping the single sounds and learning to blend while others will focus on reading simple phrases. We will now have daily literacy sessions to focus on handwriting and writing CVC words and simple phrases. Please ask your child's class teacher if you would like more information. Gruffalo words will continue to go home each week—please revise these regularly and look for them in your reading books.

Physical Development



In PE the children will be learning how to control a ball with their hands and feet.

This half term we have a PE specialist working alongside the class Teacher to help develop our ball skills.



Mathematics



This half term we will start with a focus on 2D shapes and then move on to learning about addition. We will finish the half term exploring number bonds.

Expressive arts and design



This half term we will be exploring colour mixing and painting with a purpose. We will also be experimenting with clay to create our own alien.

Understanding of the world



We will be learning about the world around us with a focus on changing seasons and our planet. We will also be conducting our own geographical fieldwork. For RE, we will be exploring stories Jesus told this half term. We will also be experimenting with ice on particularly cold days.
